In a remote area of northern Zimbabwe, Karanda Hospital performs 15 to 30 surgeries each day, and sees 200-300 outpatients. It's mission is to provide an authentic Christian witness, and it does this by providing medical services to over 70,000 people each year. Also, the facility has a Nursing school, Primary school, Evangelical Church, Awana programs, home care programs, and 5 Chaplains. This facility is staffed by missionaries, volunteers, and local Africans. (cont)

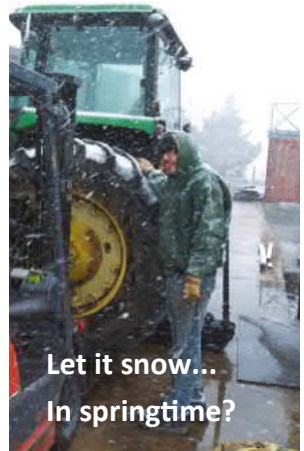

Tech Serve has been privileged to work with Karanda Hospital for the last 3 decades, helping in many ways such as telephone and electrical, networking, etc. In this case TSI is helping to ship a container full of missionary supplies, as well as a tractor for use to haul sand for the Water purification system. In addition, TSI has designed a complete fiber network for the campus, as well as all the network gear and VOIP telephone system. Everything is on-board the container for this project as well, which will happen in March



through May of 2023. If you are interesting in going to help install these systems, please let us know!



Orphanage School Building in Yamah - Ghana

Tech Serve has partnered with donors and with Water For Christ to help an orphanage in northern Ghana. Part of this assistance is a new school building for the children. On the last container to Ghana we shipped a new steel building that is 56 feet by 96 feet, enough space for 8 large classrooms and a general purpose assembly room.

TSI volunteers Larry and Millie Zaugg made the trip to Ghana to pour the 5000 sq foot foundation. Water for Christ superintendent Kelvin Shanu joined Larry and they brought in seven truckloads of sand to prepare the ground for the concrete. The children, directed by Madam Ester, had a big part in moving all of the sand and were very excited to help with their new school.

The sand was then covered with plastic, followed by the wire mesh. Soon after, 300 - 50Kg bags of Cement were mixed and placed onto the slab. Water that was needed to mix the cement came from a nearby well that was drilled by Water for Christ, and many hardworking people pitched in to carry the needed water. The orphanage director Pastor Amos and his wife provided meals each day for all of the labors. (cont.)



The new school will help educate orphans and underprivileged children. The school is directed by Pastor Amos and his dedicated team of 15 volunteers, teachers, and staff. They know that education is a great way to overcome poverty. They are committed to serving the orphans in Yamah.



In Ghana, TSI also is involved with a program that uses Christian videos on laptops and TVs to help teach the children many subjects including Math, Science, English, as well as the Good News of Jesus. If you are interested in sponsoring a laptop and TV give us a call!

We also need help funding cement blocks, windows, doors, electrical work, chairs and desks. 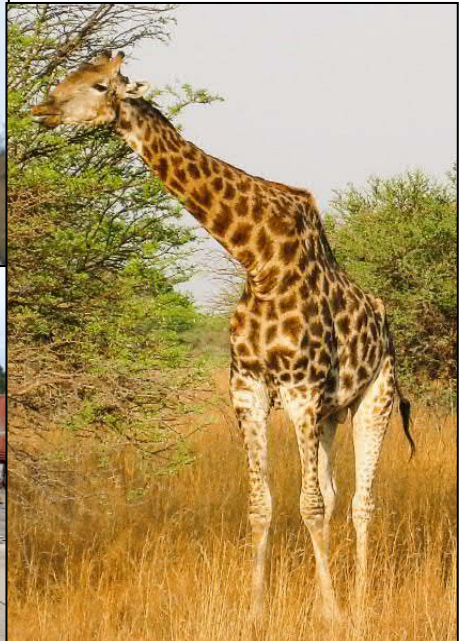
