

## **MATAMOROS CHILDREN'S HOME ELECTRICAL PROJECT**

Tech Serve has been working with Matamoros Children's Home for the last couple of decades providing them with technical expertise in several areas, to help them operate their facility efficiently. Founded in 1967, MCH currently has over 100 children in their programs. All the children attend public schools, with many of them going on to college as well. Power failures for the Home are a real problem as housing, feeding, laundry and schooling so many children without power is close to impossible. Tech Serve is working to design and oversee changes to remedy an overtaxed electrical system and provide backup when the power fails. Four Winds Church is raising money to cover the costs of upgrading the power distribution system, as well as installing multiple generators for power backup. We are privileged to be able to help this incredible organization provide a meaningful home for all of these children.

**Four Winds Church** from Conway Arkansas, has been going on trips to the home for the last 20 years. The volunteer teams perform various projects to meet the needs of the home. Tech Serve has partnered with the church to provide help in the technical areas, such as installing a complete Telephone system in 2009. Also TSI did a complete GIS Google Earth layout of all the utilities on the property, so that each system can be viewed and identified in its location and function.

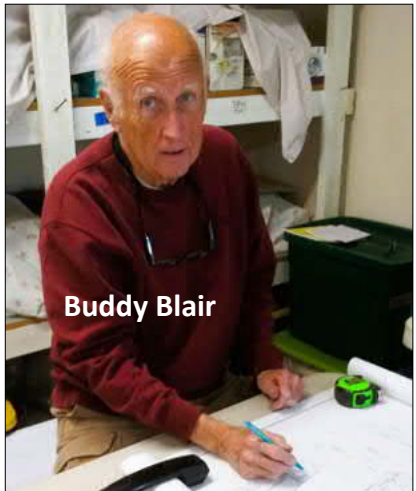

Dr. Saul Camacho grew up at MCH and has been serving as the Director for 38 years



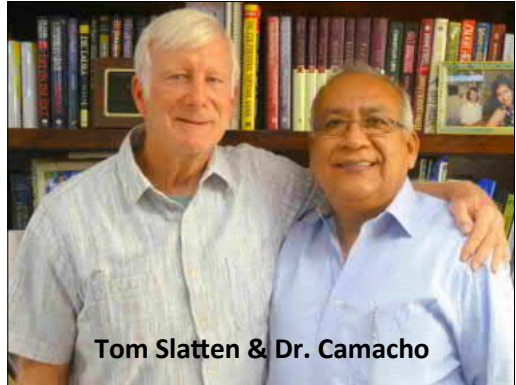

The children are all assigned daily chores for which they are responsible. Boys receive instruction in trades such as carpentry, electrical, auto mechanics, plumbing, welding, as well as raising farm animals and growing vegetables that will be used for our own consumption. Girls are trained in activities such as embroidery, sewing, weaving, healthcare as well as being taught to cook while helping with food preparation. The Children's Home makes many trips into southern Mexico, where MCH has started over 60 new churches with former students. More than 30 MCH children have been called into full time ministry.

# Medical Supplies and Equipment to Ukraine



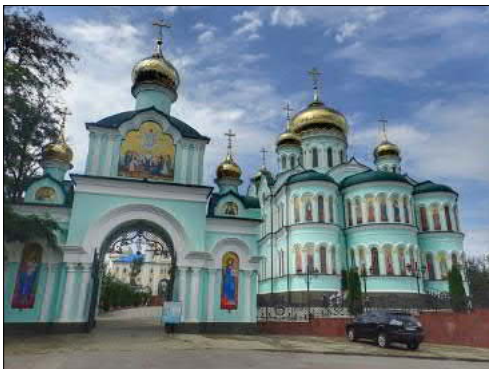
For the last decade, Tech Service has been privileged to partner with Dr. Jeff Bond, a retired ER physician from Missouri, to send surplus medical supplies around the world. Recently TSI shipped an entire container of medical supplies and equipment to Holy Ascension Monastery Hospital in Ukraine, through Global Hope in Action.



The Ukrainian monastery operates a hospital, St. Luke's Clinic, with 100 beds and 169 employees, which provides medical care to refugees and local residents. Since the beginning



of the war, the hospital has accommodated around 600-800 refugees, mostly families fleeing cities near the battle lines. The monastery has been providing shelter and support to refugees, who have been unable to find housing because of the effects of the war. Medical supplies and equipment



are greatly appreciated by the hospital, which is largely supported by donors. The monastery also operates an orphanage with about 400 children, and since the war began they have received another 300 orphans from surrounding areas.

John and Kimberly Ditty, from Global Hope in Action, drove up from Victoria Texas, to sort the supplies. Dr. Raines Chaffin from Little Rock also came up to help. When the loading took place, Russ Schultz from New Life Ranch brought some hard working young men! Garrett and Xhoni (Jonny), visiting from Albania), helped to pack the container quickly, in the 2 hour loading window.
